

What is it?



Our Enrichment choices offer a variety of activities for Lymm Sixth Form students to get involved in. Enrichment is completed in addition to students academic studies. Enrichment clubs will help develop personal skills and confidence which are integral to life outside of school.

These choices will offer students the opportunity to develop the core competencies looked for by employers and universities, which students will include in their future

What skills will enrichment help me develop?

The variety of enrichment we offer will develop many of the following skills: independence, communication skills, working with others through teamwork, resilience, flexibility, work–life balance, leadership, analysis and presentation skills (depending on the activity).

How does it work?

At Lymm High all students are expected to participate in enrichment. Students are encouraged to sign up to at least one enrichment activity each half-term. We do not put a limit to the number of activities a student can be involved in!

CHALLENGE

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

The EPQ is launched in January of Year 12, and upon completion, is worth the equivalent of an AS level. This is a self-directed project of 4000 words, which helps prepare students for the independent study needed for undergraduate courses.



The Gateway Programme

This programme is aimed at those students wishing to apply for the University of Oxford or Cambridge, or those applying to the most competitive courses (medicine, dentistry and veterinary science). This programme will support them to make a competitive application.



STEP Mathematics

This course will prepare students for the STEP (Sixth Term Examination Paper), designed to test candidates on questions that are similar in style to undergraduate mathematics. STEP is used by the University of Cambridge as their basis for conditional offers.



Rugby


Lymm High School is well known for its successes in rugby, winning both the U16 and U18 Cheshire Championships in the past.

The Model United Nations is a recreational activity in which participants assume the role of national ambassadors or representatives to debate and seek to solve global issues.

Debating Club allows students to discuss contemporary issues and world affairs alongside their peers. Students can also learn more formal debating techniques with Debate Mate where you will be coached by a university mentor and take part in nationwide competitions.



Mock Law Trials

DUKE OF Edinburgh

Skill

The Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award offers you the chance to develop a new skill or improve an existing one. Whether it's learning an instrument, perfecting a language, or mastering a craft, you'll gain valuable expertise that will set you apart in future studies or the workplace.

Residential

The Residential section involves spending time away from home, working with people you've never met before. It's an opportunity to immerse yourself in a new environment, learn new skills, and forge lasting friendships, all while developing independence and resilience.



Physical

Staying active is at the heart of the Duke of Edinburgh Award. From hiking to cycling, the physical component will challenge you to improve your fitness and stamina, while also offering a fun and rewarding way to stay healthy.



Expedition

The Expedition challenge is a highlight of the Gold Award. You'll plan, navigate, and carry out a multi-day adventure in the outdoors, developing problemsolving, teamwork, and survival skills, all while enjoying the thrill of exploring the great outdoors.

Volunteering

Volunteering is a key part of the Gold Award, allowing you to make a positive impact on your community. Whether you help at a local charity, mentor younger students, or contribute to environmental projects, your efforts will develop your leadership and teamwork skills while benefiting others.

Beyond the Award

Completing the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award is not just about earning a certificate—it's about personal growth. You'll gain resilience, confidence, and the satisfaction of achieving something significant. It's an impressive addition to your CV or university application, and a great way to push your boundaries while having fun!



LEADERSHIP Opportunities



Eco Leaders

Our Eco Reps take a lead with lower school students and members of staff on 5 key areas: biodiversity, waste, energy, water, litter. They plan and deliver assemblies, and support the application for the National Eco-Schools award.

Leadership Committee

Lead projects for Sixth Form and Lower School and gain valuable teamwork and leaderships skills.

Subject Ambassador

Suitable for students looking to enhance their knowledge of a specific subject. Students must commit to at least one lunch time or study period to support a subject/activity.

Peer Reading with Y7

This is a great way to support lower school through working with younger students to improve their reading and/or numeracy skills. Through personal relationships students will be able to help develop younger students' confidence.

Mental Health Ambassadors

Our mental health ambassadors work alongside the staff responsible for this area in school. Students will support staff promoting new initiatives and devising campaigns, all of which involve listening to our student body.
